Anjaneya Swamy observed that lack of transparency and increasing greed for money among public are the major reasons for the prevalence of corruption in society. Corruption can be eradicated through stringent laws, integrity among people and vigilance, added Prof. Swamy. On this occasion an Integrity Pledge was taken by the authorities, faculty, students and non-teaching staff. Ms O. Pranathi, coordinator of Vigilance Awareness Week 2021 remarked that the scope for investment in public services like education and health facilities can be increased by curbing the bribe in society. She also emphasised the effect of power and potential of an individual in combating corruption. Winners of Vigilance Awareness Week events were announced. Students on Vigilance Awareness Week



Karthik (BA Political Science) asserted that though India has its diplomatic strategies for development, still the country is battling with poverty, illiteracy, unemployment, lack of health facilities, increased crime rates, etc. The root cause of all these evils is corruption. Corruption is present in many government bodies sucking the blood of the poor and the needy. In order to eradicate corruption from society and to make a super power, we have to educate the public about the damage done to the growth of the country due to corrupt practices.



Theertha Sathian (MA English Language and Literature) observed that corruption is gradually gulping many public and private bodies and destroying lives of poor people with its monstrous claws. It is better late than never. People must learn to live ethically by abandoning unnecessary worldly cravings and rebuild the nation.



Nimoshini C (MA English Language and Literature) compared the growth of corruption in our nation to the growth of weed in a lawn of roses. It's a parasite that needed to be nipped in the bud before it latched on to roses and wilted them. In the same fashion as those with affluent status exploit the hard-working and impoverished for their own best interest. It is easier to succumb to these evil forces than resist and fight back with no guidance and moral support. Nonetheless, the *Vigilance Awareness Week* is an initiation of the process of fighting against and putting an end to the allpervasive corruption.

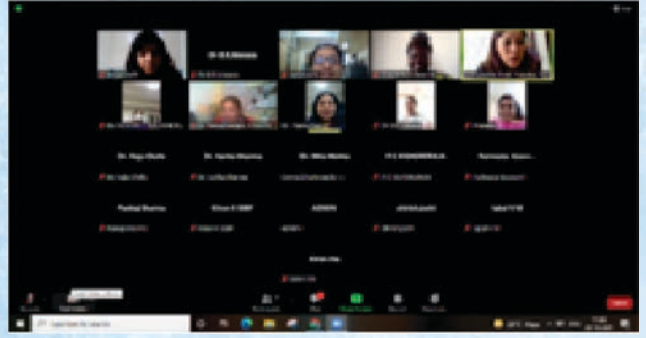
National Education Day

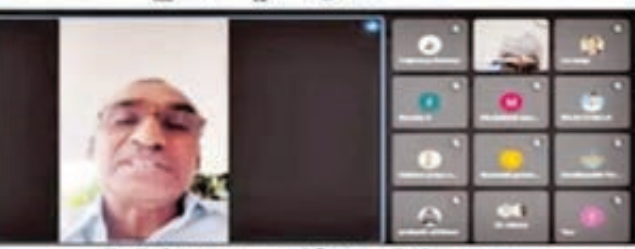

UNIVERSITIES need to urgently engage in critical review and discovery of contemporary roots in their own indigenous cultures in fields like health sciences, agriculture, social sciences, architecture, mathematics, logic, philosophy, the fine, visual and performing arts, observed Central University of AP Vice-Chancellor S A Kori, on an online workshop on re-building Indian universities, in the context of implementation of the New Education Policy by the Union government. Kori maintained that India's contribution to the world dates to thousands of years back. Although India became independent in 1947, its history, culture and science extend back to thousands of years in antiquity. Panini, a Sanskrit Grammarian, gave a comprehensive and scientific theory of phonetics, phonology and morphology. Charaka was a practitioner of the traditional system of Indian medicine known as Ayurveda. He introduced systemic perspectives for understanding biological change, cause-effect relationships, and evidence-based approach to medicine. Sushruta is considered the father of surgery. Kautilya's Arthashastra is considered a classic in political economy. Aryabhata was

a great astronomer and mathematician, who proclaimed that the earth is round, that it orbits the Sun and that it is suspended in space. His most significant contribution is the concept of zero. Nagarjuna is name synonymous with alchemy, chemistry and metallurgy. Bhaskaracharya was a great mathematician and astronomer. Deriving concept in the India's achievements, he pointed out that India was known for the 11 universities that existed from 6th century BC to 1200 AD. Takshashila is known to be the oldest. Nalanda was established in the 5th century and remained the centre of excellence till it was destroyed in the 12th century AD. Dornian schools of thought systems represented by various darshanas form the philosophical foundations of Indian knowledge and education system. It is estimated that in 600 BC the Indian system gradually evolved in several multi-disciplinary universities such as Takshashila, Nalanda, and Vikram shila.

Indian knowledge systems were completely sidelined or replaced with western systems during the British rule, he stressed. Mathematics, engineering or sciences. Total obliteration of current schools, colleges, and universities in Mumbai, Kolkata, Chennai and many other cities set off the process of establishing British education system in India. The major difference between ancient Indian education system and the modern education system seems to be that the former was in a gurukula and the latter is under a kulguru. The ancient Indian education system was much more refined and advanced than the modern education system. It focused on everyone's skills and abilities, helping them learn the art of living. Though the students were from different backgrounds, all were equal. It was holistic education. Upanishad means "the seated at the foot of the Guru to receive the teaching". Vice-Chancellor Kori felt that university education should be holistic in nature to inculcate knowledge and skills necessary to shape an individual's personality and career. For a young democracy like India, university education plays a very vital role in enhancing the benefits of demographic dividend. Appropriately guiding the youth of our country fulfill their aspirations and empowering them to contribute to nation building.

THE Central University of AP established in 2019 as part of the 2014 AP Reorganisation Act package in Anantapur district, has successfully completed two academic years and entered into third academic year braving two turbulent years of teething problems in the first year of its establishment in 2019-20 and the biggest Covid challenge in 2020-21. Ever since S A Kori was appointed the destiny Vice-chancellor of the prestigious Central University, he steered clear of all the challenges he faced to keep the rudderless boat on track and still help it to perform well from 2020-21 year onwards. He faced the Covid onslaught braving all odds and held online classes and at a later stage, offline classes strictly

adhering to Covid standard operating procedures. In all the 11 courses offered by the university 4 were under-graduate and 7 PG courses. To the delight of university management all the 120 students, who passed out of the university performed very well in on and off campus interviews and secured jobs in mostly overseas companies. The excellent performance had an electrifying effect on new students from north-east and southern states that the demand for admissions into the university shot-up in the 2021-22 academic year. Despite the infant university grappling with infrastructure and academic and teaching faculty shortage including inadequate hostel accommodation etc, as many as 2,864 applications were received for 394 seats pertaining to 16 courses including 5 new courses added for 2021-22 academic year. Bachelor of vocational courses include Retail management, Travel & Tourism etc and PG courses in-

Mathematics, Applied Economics and M.Tech in Artificial Intelligence and Data Science etc. CU VC S A Kori in an interaction with The Hans India at his chambers expressed confidence of taking the Central University in AP to glorious and national heights by taking advantage of the New Education Policy which gives

the administration greater flexibility in choosing need based life training and skills development to boost capability and employability of students coming from rural and backward districts of the country. The students coming from more than 11 states are cooperative understanding the travails of newborn university. The New Education Policy entails any student of this university to discontinue studies to go abroad for any diploma course and return even after 2-4 years and continue studies. So, the question of loss of academic year for any student does not arise. This flexibility is part of the new execution police, Kori explained. 

Its radius is 15 feet, which signifies the date 15. It has 8 faces, which signify the eighth month of the year i.e. August. Its height is 47 feet, which signifies the year 1947.
