The following Act of Parliament received the assent of the President on the 1st March, 2014, and is hereby published for general information:—

## THE ANDHRA PRADESH REORGANISATION ACT, 2014

No. 6 OF 2014

[1st March, 2014.]

An Act to provide for the reorganisation of the existing State of Andhra Pradesh and for matters connected therewith.

Be it enacted by Parliament in the Sixty-fifth Year of the Republic of India as follows:—

### PART I

#### PRELIMINARY

1. This Act may be called the Andhra Pradesh Reorganisation Act, 2014.

Short title.

2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,—

Definitions.

(a) “appointed day” means the day which the Central Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, appoint;

(b) “article” means an article of the Constitution;

(c) “assembly constituency”, “council constituency” and “parliamentary constituency” have the same meanings as in the Representation of the People Act, 1950;

## THE THIRTEENTH SCHEDULE

*(See section 93)***Education**

1. The Government of India shall take steps to establish institutions of national importance in the 12th and 13th Plan periods in the successor State of Andhra Pradesh. This would include one IIT, one NIT, one IIM, one IISER, one Central University, one Petroleum University, one Agricultural University and one IIIT.

The Central University of Andhra Pradesh, Ananthapuramu, was inaugurated by Shri Prakash Javadekar, Hon'ble Minister of Human Resources Development, Government of India, on 5 August 2018. As a temporary initial gesture, CUAP's academic activity started on the campus of Jawaharlal Nehru Technological University Anantapur. The classwork began on 6 August 2018.

## INTRODUCTION

The Andhra Pradesh Reorganization Act 2014, for the bifurcation of the existing state of Andhra Pradesh into the States of Andhra Pradesh and Telangana, received the assent of the President of India on 1 March 2014 and the same was enacted on 2 June 2014. As per Schedule 13 to the Act, the Government of India is required to establish Institutions of National Importance in the 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> Plan periods in the residual state of Andhra Pradesh, one of them being a Central University.

There are 46 Central Universities across India as on 15 January 2016 according to UGC. The Central University of Andhra Pradesh is the 47<sup>th</sup> Central University. All new Central Universities are governed by the Central Universities Act 2009, which regulates their purpose, powers, governance, etc. CUAP comes under the purview of the Department of Higher Education, Ministry of Human Resource Development. Central Universities are recognized by the University Grants Commission, which draws its power from the University Grants Commission Act 1956.

Thus, the Central University of Andhra Pradesh holds a special place in the Indian university system. It was born out of a promise made by Government of India to fulfil the aspirations of the people of Andhra Pradesh on the eve of the bifurcation of the erstwhile composite state of Andhra Pradesh into Telangana and Andhra Pradesh. The University was established in 2018 in Ananthapuramu, headquarters of the District of Anantapur in the backward Rayalaseema region of Andhra Pradesh. The District of Anantapur is the largest district in terms of area in Andhra Pradesh and seventh largest district in India. The region has immense historical significance as it forms the part of the Vijayanagara Empire ruled by majestic king Sri Krishnadevaraya, among others. The folklore of the region is richly filled with the stories of Sri Krishnadevaraya's people-centric rule and the several welfare schemes he introduced. That apart, the region is also known for its mineral deposits and salubrious climate of the Deccan Plateau. The region is also known for sericulture and horticulture crops. As a feather in its cap, the global auto-manufacturer KIA started its operations in a green field project, just 60 km away from Ananthapuramu. Further, Ananthapuramu is also a prominent educational hub with institutions of higher education such as Sri Krishnadevaraya University, Jawaharlal Nehru Technological University, Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Learning, Government Medical College, and a century-old Government Arts College, apart from a host of engineering colleges.

The establishing of the Central University of Andhra Pradesh heralds a new era in the sphere of higher education. With innovative socially and culturally relevant academic programmes, the university is poised for rapid growth in the years to come. Transforming students into knowledgeable and responsible citizens of the nation through value-based education with an emphasis on interactive learning coupled with hands-on experience is the hallmark of this new university. Accordingly, the university envisages to offer demand-driven multi-disciplinary courses focusing on experiential learning through several short- and long-term vocational courses in active collaboration with the industry.

The University, in course of time, will also rollout Study India Programme to cater to the needs of foreign students with academic grades/credits transfer option.

The objects of the Central University of Andhra Pradesh Society shall be to disseminate and advance knowledge by providing instructional and research facilities in such branches of learning as it may deem fit; to make special provisions for integrated courses in humanities, social sciences, and science and technology in its educational programmes; to take appropriate measures for promoting innovations in teaching-learning process and inter-disciplinary studies and research; to educate and train manpower for the development of the country; to establish linkages with industries for the promotion of science and technology; and to pay special attention to the improvement of the social and economic conditions and welfare of the people, their intellectual, academic, and cultural development.



## THE UNIVERSITY EMBLEM AND ITS SIGNIFICANCE



The sun symbol was once the alchemical symbol for gold, the most perfect of the metals. It represented the perfection of all matter on any level, including that of the mind, spirit, and soul. It is a symbol of origin that represents the completing of the Great Work. The sun represents life, influence, and strength. The open book represents the spreading of and the unlimited access to quality education. Sri Krishnadevaraya of the Tuluva dynasty was a great ruler of the Vijayanagar empire, with Penukonda in Anantapur District as its summer capital. He issued many gold coins and one of his extremely rare double pagoda coins depicts the standing Lord Venkateswara with a discus in his right hand and a conch in his left hand. The right front hand is in the *varada mudra* and the left one on his hip. The reverse has a three-line Nagari legend *sri-krishnara-ya*. One of the contributions of the Vijayanagara empire was the remarkable improvement in the currency system in south India, completely changing the scarcity of coins that existed prior to its period. It has both historical and mythological significance. The *purna kalasha* is considered a symbol of abundance and “source of life” in the Vedas. The *purna-kumbha* is preeminently a Vedic motif, known from the time of the *Rigveda*.

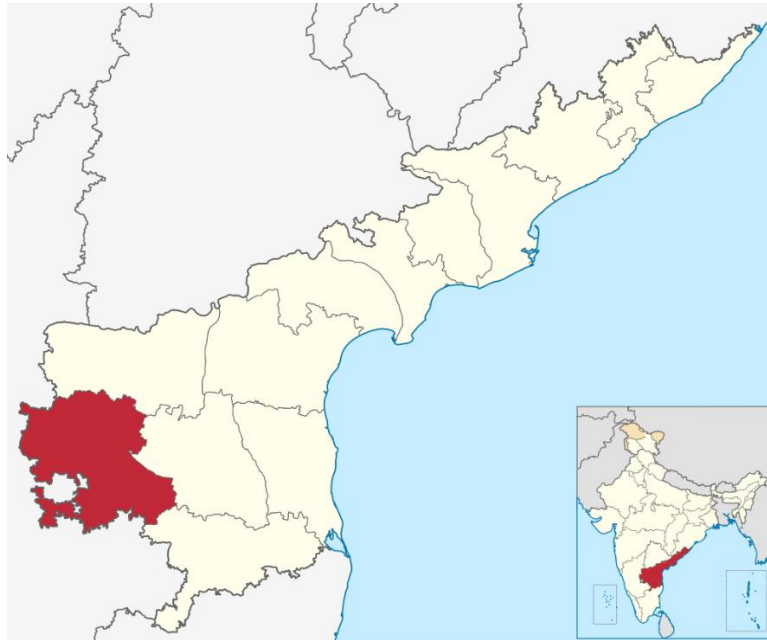

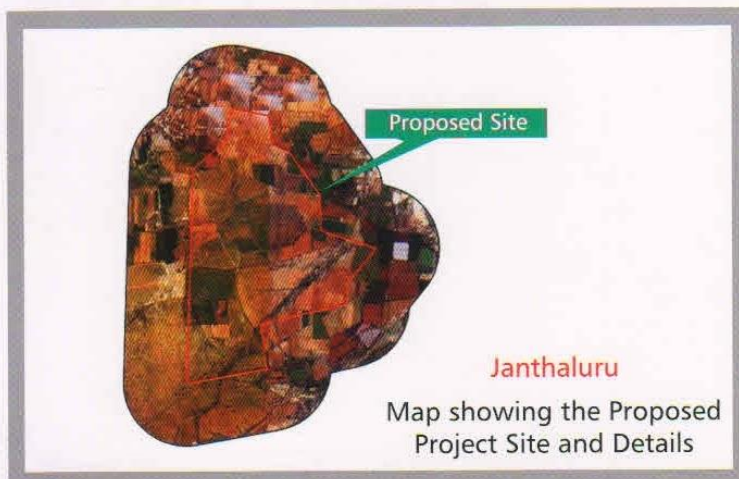
