Having a Master's degree with a UGC NET certificate demonstrates your competence and increases your chances of being hired. Companies that are PSUs frequently hire UGC NET qualified people for a variety of roles in areas such as research and development, human resources, finance, and so on.

To summarise, there are several options available to you after passing the UGC NET. This exam allows you to broaden your employment opportunities in a variety of sectors. I am glad that our university syllabus is designed to enable the students to get through this National Level Exam. The faculty emphasise the concepts and testing modes whenever there is a possibility and create awareness in the students. We are even planning for free coaching sessions for the aspirants in our university.

I take this opportunity to thank every member of the University community for their active participation in the various academic activities and administrative reforms that the University has taken up. Let us rededicate ourselves to the cause of higher education.

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Lepakshi – A visual treat

Lepakshi, a small village tucked away in remote part of Ananthapuramu District, Andhra Pradesh, is situated approximately 120 kms North of Bangalore. The historic city is connected with the Ramayana of Valmiki. According to the Ramayana, Rama met dying Jatayu (The bird that tried to save Sita from demon Ravana's clutches) and uttered the words of "Le pakshi" which means "Rise, bird" in Telugu. Hence the name Lepakshi.

Lepakshi is archaeologically significant for its shrines and sculptures. Built during the times of the Vijayanagar Empire (1336-1646), Lepakshi is famous for its spell-binding Hanging Pillar, the spectacular Nandi (Bull), India's biggest monolithic sculpture in rock (27' in length and 15' in height), mammoth Ganesha and massive Naga (Serpent) with coils and hoods. One also cannot miss the finest mural paintings of that period. The frescoes, still retaining their original beauty, show an impressive attention to detail with contrasting colours.

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
