National Seminar on Breaking Barriers and Building Futures: Empowering Women Entrepreneurs in MSMEs for Vision Viksit Bharat @2047

The Department of Economics in collaboration with the Centre for Economic and Social Studies (CESS), Hyderabad, and ICFAI School of Social Science organised a two-day national seminar on “Breaking Barriers and Building Futures: Empowering Women Entrepreneurs in MSMEs for Vision Viksit Bharat@2047” on 18–19 July 2025 at CESS, Hyderabad. The event was financially supported by the Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR), SERP-Telangana, Stree Nidhi (Government of Telangana), SIDBI-Telangana, and WASSAN.

The seminar was inaugurated by Dr. G. Chinna Reddy, Vice Chairman, Telangana State Planning Board, who emphasized the transformative role of women entrepreneurs in achieving India’s development goals. Distinguished guests and speakers included Prof. E. Revathi (Director, CESS), Prof. C. Sheela Reddy (Registrar), Dr. Eranti Vijaya (Director, SEM, Ni-MSME), Prof. L. S. Ganesh (Vice-Chancellor, ICFAI Foundation), Ms. N. Sumathi (Ministry of MSME, Government of India), and leading scholars such as Prof. D. Narsimha Reddy, Prof. S. Galab, Prof. K. Hanumatha Rao, Prof. C. Sambhi Murthy, Prof. Srijit Mishra, Prof. Sanjaya Fuloria, Prof. S. Vijayalakshmi, among others.

Over two days, the seminar hosted paper presentations and panel discussions on critical themes such as digital entrepreneurship, access to credit, SHG-led business models, sectoral issues in textiles and agriculture, policy frameworks, and emerging startup ecosystems. A distinctive feature was the way academic research was woven together with the lived experiences of women entrepreneurs, who shared their journeys of overcoming barriers, adapting to digital markets, and innovating within challenging circumstances. This combination of scholarship and practice enriched the deliberations and brought out practical strategies for inclusive growth.


The seminar highlighted that empowering women entrepreneurs in the MSME sector is not only a gender imperative but a developmental necessity. Discussions underscored the need to address barriers such as limited financial access, lack of digital literacy, and gender-blind policy measures. At the same time, participants recognized and celebrated successful institutional models and grassroots innovations that have already made significant contributions to women’s empowerment and local economic growth.

The seminar concluded with a set of recommendations for building a more enabling ecosystem for women entrepreneurs, including improving access to collateral-free credit, strengthening digital skills, and adopting gender-sensitive policies. Ensuring Safe and Inclusive Workplaces: Sexual Harassment of Women at the Workplace Act and UGC Guidelines




Two-Day Distinguished Guest Lecture on Entrepreneurship Development

On 7 August 2025, students from the Biotechnology, Botany, and Zoology departments of KTS Government Degree College, Rayadurg, visited our Department of Molecular Biology as part of their academic enrichment program. The visit aimed to provide exposure to advanced molecular biology techniques, laboratory practices, and academic opportunities available at the university.

Upon arrival, the visitors were warmly welcomed by our faculty and students. The programme began with an interactive session where our faculty introduced the visitors to the Department of Molecular Biology, explaining its focus on skill-based training, research-oriented learning, and various academic programs. Emphasis was placed on the importance of practical skills in modern biology and biotechnology studies. Our students demonstrated the working of key laboratory instruments and techniques, carefully explaining the principles, functions, and applications of each. Invited Lecture by Prof. Satyawada Rama Rao

Prof. Satyawada Rama Rao, a distinguished Retired professor from the Department of Biotechnology and Bioinformatics, North-Eastern Hill University (NEHU), Shillong, Meghalaya, delivered an enlightening two-day lecture series on “Molecular Biology, its Interface with Other Branches of Biology” for the 1st- and 2nd- year M.Sc. students on the 22nd and 23rd August. This event provided an invaluable opportunity for students to interact with one of the most respected experts in the field of molecular biology.

The sessions were designed to provide both foundational knowledge and advanced insights, bridging the gap between textbook learning and current research trends. During the lectures, Prof. Rama Rao gave a comprehensive overview of the central dogma of molecular biology, emphasizing the flow of genetic information from DNA to RNA to proteins. He elaborated on the intricate mechanisms of gene expression and regulation, highlighting how cellular functions are orchestrated at the molecular level.

In addition, he discussed the dynamic interface of molecular biology with biochemistry, particularly focusing on enzymes, metabolites, and metabolic pathways, highlighting their relevance in understanding life processes in a holistic manner. The sessions also explored the interdisciplinary nature of molecular biology, demonstrating how this core discipline connects with diverse fields such as biotechnology, medicine, microbiology, and bioinformatics. The event not only enhanced academic understanding but also broadened students’ perspectives on how scientific knowledge can be translated into meaningful societal impact. For many, this lecture series served as a motivating force to pursue higher studies, research careers, and innovative projects in the life sciences. The University of Andhra Pradesh sincerely acknowledges and appreciates the invaluable contribution of Prof. Satyawada Rama Rao. His presence on campus has significantly enriched the academic environment, leaving a lasting impression on both faculty and students.



Distinguished lecture on Philosophy, Geography, and Contemporary Concerns

The Department of Geography and Geoinformatics organised a distinguished lecture on Philosophy, Geography and Contemporary Concerns on August 29, 2025. The event aimed to explore the intersection of philosophical thinking and geographical study in addressing today's pressing challenges.

The program began under the guidance of Prof. G. Ram Reddy, Dean of Student Welfare. Dr. Saumya Singh from the Department introduced the objectives, framing the lecture as an intellectual bridge between philosophical perspectives and geographic realities.

The keynote address was delivered by Dr. Sachidanand Sinha, retired professor from JNU's Centre for the Study of Regional Development, on the theme "Human Geography: Evolution and Perspectives." Dr. Sinha traced the historical development of human geography, highlighting its origins in institutions like Aligarh Muslim University (AMU) and its evolution as an interdisciplinary field influenced by colonial history, philosophy, and political contexts.

Dr. Sachidanand Sinha discussed key philosophical shifts from environmental determinism to possibilism, and the role of geography in nation-building, social change, and democracy, referencing thinkers like Immanuel Kant. He also addressed how Marxist and neoliberal ideologies shaped the discipline-highlighting issues such as poverty, exploitation, and welfare-as well as the legacy of mercantile capitalism in shaping global systems.

Dr. Sinha concluded that human geography is far more than the study of people and places- it is deeply connected to philosophy, politics, and social justice, offering tools to understand and address contemporary issues. The session concluded with a lively Q&A, leaving students and faculty with valuable insights into the evolving role of geography in modern academic and societal discourse.

Debate Club Activities

Skill Development Activities




ALUMNI CORNER


