
#### International Day of Yoga

## **Centre allocated ₹700 cr** for CUAP infra works: VC

ANANTAPUR

CENTRAL University of Anchra Pradesh Vice-Chancellor SA Kori revealed that the Central govern ment has earmarked Rs 700 crore for the first and second phase of building project and Rs 150 crore has been released for taking up civil infrastructure works unde the first phase. Works will be executed by the Central Public Works Department (CPWD) in 3-4 months, according to a university press release. The first des-tiny VC revealed that the Indian Army authorities had approached the CUAP to accord recognition to its 2-year diploma course for defence personnel. "This is a rare mour to a young university ac-



The Gooty Fort is a seventh century architectural remnant on the Bellary-Krishnapatnam highway of Anantapur District. The word Gooty (locally pronounced "Gutti") is derived from the town's original name, Gowthampuri. It is one of the centrally protected monuments of national importance. The earliest of the existing fortifications and other structures can be dated to the late Chalukya period. The fort was seized by the Qutub Shahi dynasty from Venkata II of the Vijayanagara Empire. It was then won over by the Maratha General Murari Rao who had to surrender later to the Emperor of Mysore, Hyder Ali. The fort was last held under the control by Sir Thomas Munro of the East India Company. We find the mortal remains of Sir Thomas Munro at the foothill of the Gooty Fort.
