# Campus Highlights

## Karmayogi Training Programme Held at the University

The discussion covered avenues for academic collaboration, student exchange, research linkages, and broader educational cooperation between Indian and Chinese higher educational institutions.

Sheela Reddy, Dean and Registrar (i/c), joined the Vice-Chancellor in felicitating the visiting diplomats and acknowledged the significance of such engagements for a young and rapidly growing university like the Central University of Andhra Pradesh, Ananthapuramu. The Chinese delegates expressed appreciation for the hospitality and showed keen interest in university's interdisciplinary programmes and community-oriented initiatives. The visit provided students with an opportunity to interact directly with foreign diplomats and gain insights into international diplomacy and global education trends. The event concluded with a formal vote of thanks, marking a promising step towards strengthening the University's global academic outreach.



## **A special talk on Aatmanirbhar Bharat by the state Health Minister, Andhra Pradesh**

The Central University of Andhra Pradesh hosted a special lecture on Aatmanirbhar Bharat delivered by Shri Satyakumar Yadav, Hon'ble Minister for Health, Family Welfare, and Medical Education, Government of Andhra Pradesh. Speaking to students, faculty, and invited guests, the Minister reflected on the national vision of self-reliance and underscored that the idea of a self-sustaining India is anchored in three foundational principles- Swadeshi, Swabhasha, and Swabhusha. He encouraged the younger generation to cultivate pride in indigenous production, preserve the richness of Indian languages, and uphold the country's cultural heritage.

In his address, the Minister pointed out that although India once held a prominent position as a global exporter, long periods of foreign rule shifted the nation toward import dependency. He remarked that under the present leadership at the Centre, India has re-emerged as a confident and capable economy. Recalling the COVID-19 pandemic, he highlighted how India demonstrated remarkable resilience by manufacturing masks, diagnostic kits, and vaccines domestically and supplying them to more than a hundred countries.



Shri Yadav also referred to several national initiatives, Make in India, Digital India, Skill India, and Startup India, as crucial to strengthening domestic innovation and employment generation. Pointing to recent investments, including Google's proposed AI Centre in Visakhapatnam, he emphasised that the country is steadily transitioning from the earlier focus on "Ease of Doing Business" to achieving the "Speed of Doing Business." He called upon students and the wider community to support indigenous industries, promote innovation, and contribute actively to reducing unemployment and poverty.

The programme was presided over by Prof. S. A. Kori, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, and was also graced by Prof. C. Sheela Reddy, Dean and Registrar (i/c). Faculty members and administrative staff from the central university of Andhra Pradesh, Ananthapuramu, and neighbouring institutions, the District Health Officer, local public representatives, and members of the media and students of the university were present for the event. The session concluded with a vote of thanks proposed by Prof. Ramareddy, Dean, Student Welfare, and the programme was anchored by Dr. Manoja Padyala.



## Message by the Honorable Prime Minister on Constitution Day



Dear fellow citizens, Namaste!

26 November is a day of immense pride for every Indian. It was on this very day in 1949 that the Constituent Assembly adopted the Constitution of India, a sacred document that has continued to guide the nation's progress with clarity and conviction. That is why, nearly a decade ago, in 2015, the NDA government decided to mark 26th November as Constitution Day. It is the power of our Constitution that enabled a person like me, coming from a humble and economically disadvantaged family, to serve as the Head of the Government continuously for over 24 years. I still remember the moments in 2014 when I came to Parliament for the first time and bowed, touching the steps of the greatest temple of democracy. Again, in 2019, after the election results, when I entered the Central Hall of Samvidhan Sadan, I bowed and placed the Constitution on my forehead as a mark of reverence. This Constitution has given several others, like me, the power to dream and the strength to work towards it.

On Constitution Day, we remember all the inspiring members of the Constituent Assembly, which was presided over by Dr. Rajendra Prasad, who contributed to the making of the Constitution. We recall the efforts of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar, who chaired the Drafting Committee with remarkable foresight. Several distinguished women members of the Constituent Assembly enriched the Constitution with their thoughtful interventions and visionary perspectives.

My mind goes back to the year 2010. This was when the Constitution of India completed 60 years. Sadly, the occasion did not receive the attention it deserved at a national level. But, to express our collective gratitude and commitment to the Constitution, we organised a 'Samvidhan Gaurav Yatra' in Gujarat. Our Constitution was placed on an elephant, and I, along with several other people from different walks of life, had the honor of being part of the procession. When the Constitution completed 75 years, we decided that this would be an extraordinary milestone for the people of India. We had the privilege of organising a special session of Parliament and launching nationwide programs to commemorate this historic occasion. These programs witnessed record public participation.

This year's Constitution Day is special for many reasons. It marks the 150th birth anniversary of two extraordinary personalities, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel and Bhagwan Birsa Munda. Both of them made monumental contributions to our nation. Sardar Patel's visionary leadership ensured the political unification of India. It was his inspiration and courage of conviction that guided our steps to act against Article 370 and 35(A). The Constitution of India is now fully in force in Jammu & Kashmir, ensuring all constitutional rights for the people, especially the women and marginalized communities. The life of Bhagwan Birsa Munda continues to inspire India's resolve to ensure justice, dignity, and empowerment for our tribal communities.

This year, we also celebrate the 150th anniversary of Vande Mataram, whose words resonate with the collective resolve of Indians through the ages. At the same time, we commemorate the 350th martyrdom anniversary of Sri Guru Teg Bahadur Ji, whose life and sacrifice continue to illuminate us with courage, compassion and strength. All these personalities and milestones remind us of the primacy of our duties, something the Constitution also emphasises through a dedicated chapter on Fundamental Duties in Article 51A.

These duties guide us on how to collectively achieve social and economic progress. Mahatma Gandhi always emphasised the duties of a citizen. He believed that a duty well performed creates a corresponding right and that real rights are a result of the performance of duty. 25 years have already passed since this century began. In just over two decades from now, we will mark 100 years since freedom from colonial rule. In 2049, it will be a hundred years since the Constitution was adopted. The policies we frame, the decisions we take today and our collective actions will shape the lives of generations to come.

Inspired by this, as we move forward to realise the dream of a Viksit Bharat, we must always place our duties towards our nation foremost in our minds. Our country has given us so much, and this brings out a deep sense of gratitude from within. And, when we live with this feeling, fulfilling our duties becomes integral to our nature. To carry out our duties, it becomes imperative to put in our full capability and dedication in every task. Every action of ours should strengthen the Constitution and further national goals and interests. It is, after all, our responsibility to fulfill the dreams envisioned by the framers of our Constitution. When we work with this sense of duty, our nation's social and economic progress will multiply manifold.

Our Constitution has given us the right to vote. As citizens, it is our duty to never miss the opportunity to vote in national, state, and local elections where we are registered. In order to inspire others, we can think of organising special ceremonies every 26 November in schools and colleges to celebrate those youngsters who are turning 18. This way our first-time voters will feel that in addition to being students, they are also active participants in the process of nation-building. When we inspire our youth with a sense of responsibility and pride, they will remain committed to the values of democracy throughout their lives. This sense of commitment is the foundation of a strong nation. Let us, on this Constitution Day, reaffirm our pledge to fulfill our duties as citizens of this great nation. In doing so, we can all contribute meaningfully to the building of a Viksit Bharat that is developed and empowered.

## One-day Workshop on NAAC Accreditation Process

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), Central University of Andhra Pradesh, organized a one-day workshop on the NAAC Accreditation Process on 09 December 2025.

The workshop was graced by Prof. Rama Kondapalli (Keynote Speaker & Resource Person, MANUU and Regional Director, CRSP), Prof. C. Sheela Reddy (Dean of Academics), senior professors, NAAC Criterion Coordinators, IQAC Department Coordinators, faculty members, and administrative staff.

Dr. Y. Kesava Reddy, Convenor, welcomed the participants and outlined the University's progress in NAAC preparedness. Prof. C. Sheela Reddy inaugurated the workshop and appreciated the efforts of IQAC in strengthening quality awareness.

In the technical session, Prof. Rama Kondapalli delivered an in-depth presentation on the evolving NAAC framework, recent reforms, criteria-wise indicators, documentation requirements, best practices, data integrity, outcome-based education, and continuous quality enhancement. ## Green Nanomedicine Poised to Revolutionize Cancer Care and Advance Sustainable Healthcare, Says Prof. S. A. Kori, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor of Central University of Andhra Pradesh



The Honourable Vice-Chancellor of the Central University of Andhra Pradesh, Prof. S. A. Kori was invited as the Chief Guest for the inaugural session of the Two-Day National Symposium and Workshop on Green Nanomedicine, held on 22–23 December 2025 at the prestigious Sharda University, Greater Noida, Delhi (NCR).

Prof. S. A. Kori was invited with great honour by the Vice-Chancellor, Pro Vice-Chancellor, and Deans of Sharda University, with due respect and distinction. During his keynote address, Prof. Kori highlighted nearly fourteen emerging technologies that are currently driving major advancements in the field of science and technology. He emphasized that nanotechnology is one of the most transformative among them. He further emphasized that green nanomedicine holds exceptional promise in addressing critical global health challenges, particularly in the effective treatment of cancer, which remains the second leading cause of mortality worldwide after cardiovascular diseases.

Prof. Kori also explained the India's expanding footprint in nanomedicine, both nationally and globally, and elaborated on the pivotal role of bio-inspired and bio-derived materials in advancing sustainable and environmentally responsible nanomedical applications in healthcare and the role of universities in advancing green nanomedicine through ethical research and sound regulation, noting that green-synthesized nanoparticles are biocompatible, stable, and suitable for medical use due to natural reducing and stabilizing agents.

Prof. S. A. Kori highlighted the growing importance of phytochemical-mediated nanoparticles due to their intrinsic bioactivity and synergistic therapeutic effects. He noted that biodegradable and bioinspired nanocarriers such as lignin, silk fibroin, chitosan, and exosome-mimetic systems—offer significant translational potential. For example, neem-derived silver nanoparticles exhibit broad-spectrum antimicrobial, anti-inflammatory, antioxidant, and anticancer properties with minimal toxicity, while eco-friendly silver nanoparticles from *Erythroxylum monogynum* leaf extract show dose-dependent cytotoxicity against breast cancer cells, underscoring their promising applications in healthcare and targeted drug delivery.

Prof. S. A. Kori also stated that the application of AI and machine learning can accelerate the optimization of synthesis protocols, predict complex biological interactions, and improve reproducibility addressing key challenges that currently limit translational progress. Furthermore, he pointed out that advancements in 3D bioprinting and organ-on-chip platforms will allow more accurate, physiologically relevant evaluation of green nanomaterials, paving the way for safer and more effective clinical applications. Participants of the workshop, students, volunteers, heads of departments, higher authorities of Sharda University, and distinguished guests from across India, were captivated by Prof. S. A. Kori's Presentation.

Guest of Honour Dr. Huma Mustafa, Secretary, Council of Science and Technology, Government of Uttar Pradesh, delivered an address highlighting the significance, societal relevance, and potential of green nanomedicine in advancing sustainable healthcare. The symposium was organized by Dr. Piyush Gupta, Head of the Centre for Biomaterials, Sharda University, who served as the Event Secretary.

## **Growing Need for Increasing Space to Non-State Actors in Public Policy Making – Former Karnataka Chief Secretary S V Ranganath at CUAP**

S. V. Ranganath, IAS (Retd.), Former Chief Secretary, Government of Karnataka, delivered a highly insightful and exceptionally enriching distinguished lecture on “Public Policy and Governance: Practices and challenges” at the Central University of Andhra Pradesh in Ananthapuramu. The former secretary said that there was a growing need for increasing space to non-state actors in public policy domain for policy empowerment while asserting and advising the policy planner and executor to be change friendly.

The lecture provided a comprehensive and structured understanding of public policy as an instrument of governance, extending well beyond theoretical frameworks typically available in standard academic literature. His lecture contextualised public policy within institutional realities, administrative constraints, and political economy considerations, while offering a nuanced perspective that is rarely accessible to academic communities.

Shri Ranganath delved on the facets of public policy, including the role of the executive, legislature, and judiciary, as well as the critical involvement of academia, civil society, and the private sector, reinforced the importance of collaborative and inclusive governance.

The former chief secretary reflected on state capacity, institutional building, regulatory discretion, and rule-based governance and made observations on the limitations of coercive power in public administration. He went on to discuss on public choice theory, management of common resources, social equity, and polycentric governance which enriched the understanding of how policies must balance efficiency, fairness, and sustainability.

The practical insights shared through real-life policy experiences—particularly on negotiation, phased implementation, pilot projects, and evidence-based decision-making—provided invaluable lessons for both students and faculty members of the university. His articulation that policy-making is a long-term, deliberative process rather than a short-term, event-driven exercise left a lasting impression on all participants.

His emphasis on institutional learning, leadership development, and continuous improvement resonated strongly with the mission of the Central University of Andhra Pradesh to contribute meaningfully to public policy research and capacity building.

Earlier, Prof. S.A. Kori, Vice Chancellor, CUAP welcomed the former chief secretary along with two other retired IAS officers Shri, Jawaid Akhtar and Shri MB Dyaberi who visited the university and showed them the new campus and the various facilities provided by the university to the students.

The distinguished lecture was well attended by students, faculty and the staff of the university. It was followed by an enriching question and answer session.




## UN Day Celebration on the theme of “Promoting Peace, Unity and Global Partnerships”

The event was graced by Dr. Babu G., Associate Professor, Department of Political Science, who delivered an enlightening address on the formation, purpose, and evolution of the United Nations, along with its continuous efforts toward maintaining international peace and security. Additionally, Dr. Pankaj Kumar, Assistant Professor (T & C), Department of Political Science, addressed the students and shared valuable insights on global partnerships, sustainability, and the role of youth in building a harmonious world.

Additionally, three students, namely Mr. Chandavath Nageshwara Rao, Mr. Rahul Singh, and Ms. Geethika, presented papers. ## Indian Constitution Day Celebration- 2025, “Transformation of employment by Digital landscape” by Hari Chandana, IAS

Smt. Harichandana Dasari, IAS and Hyderabad District Collector, addressed the gathering on the theme “Digital Livelihood and Constitutional Values: Ensuring Equity in the New Economy” and explained how the expanding digital landscape is transforming employment across the country, especially for gig and freelance workers. While acknowledging the flexibility and opportunities provided by digital platforms, she stressed the urgent need for strong policy measures to safeguard workers’ rights. She called for guaranteed social security, fair wages, and improved access to digital tools to uphold the constitutional principles of equality and justice. She urged students and young people to recognise issues of digital inclusion and to advocate for fairness as technology continues to advance.



The Honourable Vice Chancellor of the University, Prof. S. A. Kori, stated that ‘the Constitution of India is oxygen to its national life’ while addressing the gathering on the eve of celebration of Constitution Day’ which was conducted by the Department of Political Science, Central University of Andhra Pradesh. He emphasised that justice, equality, and dignity are the core principles of the Indian Constitution, recalling Dr. B.R. Ambedkar’s significant contributions. He noted that as digital growth accelerates, it is essential to ensure that technological progress creates equal opportunities for all. Stressing the importance of digital literacy, he highlighted that access to technology is vital for inclusive development. He encouraged responsible digital citizenship and the ethical use of technology, urging students to uphold constitutional values in the digital era.

As part of the celebrations, the department conducted a quiz competition and a distinguished lecture. The programme began with a welcome address by Dr. Babu G, Head of the Department (I/C), who briefly highlighted the significance of the Constitution. This was followed by the programme convener, Dr. P. Ramakrishna Reddy, who discussed the background and theme of the event. The event was attended by all teaching staff, as well as non-teaching staff, research scholars, and students of the university and neighbouring colleges in and around Anantapur. The event formally concluded with the constitutional pledge and a vote of thanks delivered by Political Science students Carol Worth, Maithri, and Varshitha, respectively.

## **Discussion on Nobel Prize in Economic Sciences.**

The session was held by the Department of Economics, on the topic of the “Nobel Prize in Economic Sciences-2025.” The session brought together faculty members, students and research scholars to discuss the noble laureates’ (Joel Mokyr, Philippe Aghion and Peter Howitt) contributions, with special emphasis on the conceptual framework of technological progress, innovation, creative destruction and their implications for economic policy and research. The Department convened this discussion to introduce students and faculty to the Nobel-winning contributions in a structured way; evaluate the policy and research implications of the laureates’ work; and motivate department members to pursue research aligned with the themes of innovation and institutional support for Research and Development .

Prof. B. Venkateshwarlu, Head of the department began the event with an inaugural speech that highlighted the major strands of the Nobel Prize winners. He provided an overview of the theoretical contributions, explaining how the Nobel Prize winners formalise the process of technological progress and the mechanism of creative destruction. He also emphasised the relevance of these ideas for policymaking and academic research, and formally opened the floor for subsequent presentations and discussions.

Dr. Mishra consolidated practical advice for the audience, outlining concrete steps that students and researchers can take to design research projects that follow the rigor of Nobel-calibre work. He covered research design, data considerations, and engagement with theoretical frameworks. Meanwhile, Dr. P. A. Naidu described the historical trajectory of scholars who have achieved the Nobel Prize, emphasising the timing, cumulative achievements, and the academic ecosystems that support such success. He offered insights into publication strategy and scholarly networking. In addition, Dr. M. Kulashekhar highlighted contemporary research trends among students and early-career researchers, particularly noting excellent contributions from agricultural economics and related fields. He stressed the silent but transformative impact of student research on real-world outcomes.


Mr. Anurag Vikram Singh, a student of Department of Economics, delivered an in-depth exposition of the original Nobel-winning paper. His presentation covered the authors’ core assumptions, model structure, and the empirical evidence supporting the claims. He also discussed practical implications: how the model guides firm-level innovation decisions and how one might test these mechanisms with modern data. Mr. Raghava Reddy, a research scholar of the Department of Economics, spoke about the Nobel selection process and the institutional criteria often considered by awarding bodies.

He discussed factors that increase visibility for research, including clarity of contribution, replicable empirical evidence, and policy relevance. The session concluded with remarks by Prof. M. D. Bavaiah, who provided concluding insights, linking the laureates’ work to policy frameworks and R&D support strategies across countries. He stressed how these ideas have guided several governments to create enabling environments for innovation and sustainable development.

This section synthesizes the speakers' points and connects them to actionable policy and research directions. Key themes include:

1. Creative destruction and sectoral reallocation: Implications for social safety nets and reskilling programs when disruptive innovation occurs.
2. Institutional incentives for R&D: Designing subsidies, tax incentives, and direct public investment that channel resources into productive innovation.
3. Agricultural innovation: Opportunities for productivity gains through technology adoption and institutional support for smallholders.
4. Measurement and empirical strategy: Recommendations for how researchers can empirically evaluate innovation outcomes using firm-level and region-level datasets.


The discussion reaffirmed the importance of the Nobel-winning contributions for both theoretical enrichment and practical policy design. The session helped participants appreciate the interplay between model assumptions, empirical validation, and policy relevance.



## Poster Presentation Competition

As part of the revision of the semester syllabus, the Department of Commerce organized a Poster Presentation Competition for the courses Financial Accounting and Business Economics. The objective of the competition was to explore and showcase students' subject knowledge as well as their creative and analytical skills.

The competition was open to B.Com. (Hons.) and BBA first-semester students. A total of seven individual and 16 group posters were presented by the participants. A panel of faculty members evaluated the posters based on relevance, content clarity, innovation, and presentation. Five posters were selected as the best, and prizes were awarded to the winners in recognition of their outstanding performance.





## One-Day Workshop on “Primer on Qualitative Research: Thematic Analysis

The Central University of Andhra Pradesh continues to strengthen its academic and research ecosystem through thoughtfully designed capacity-building initiatives. In this direction, the Department of Management organized a One-Day Workshop on “Premier on Qualitative Research: Thematic Analysis,” reflecting the university’s sustained focus on improving research quality among faculty members and research scholars.

The workshop was conducted under the leadership of the Hon’ble Vice-Chancellor, Prof. S. A. Kori, whose vision consistently emphasises methodological rigor and meaningful scholarship. With the academic guidance of the Dean (Academics), Prof. C. Sheela Reddy, the programme aimed to introduce participants to qualitative research as a powerful approach for understanding complex social phenomena.

The sessions were led by Dr Abhilash Ponnampallam, Associate Professor, Department of Management, who adopted an engaging storytelling-based pedagogical approach to explain qualitative research concepts. The workshop unfolded in three structured sessions: an introduction to qualitative research, an exploration of different qualitative research approaches, and a detailed discussion on the stages of thematic analysis. By linking research concepts to real-life narratives, the sessions enabled participants to appreciate qualitative inquiry as both systematic and interpretive.

The programme witnessed active participation from 41 faculty members and research scholars from the University as well as neighboring institutions such as Sri Krishnadevaraya University, JNTUA, and Sri Sathya Sai Institute of Higher Learning. The interactive nature of the discussions and practical illustrations generated strong interest and positive motivation among participants to adopt qualitative research methods in their scholarly work.

Through initiatives such as this workshop, the University continues to nurture a vibrant research culture that encourages critical thinking, methodological clarity, and academic excellence, reaffirming its commitment to quality higher education and research-driven learning.



## Deeksharambh–Student Induction Program on Cyber Hygiene

The Department of Computer Science and Artificial Intelligence organised an interactive awareness programme titled “Cyber Hygiene– Deeksharambh.” The session aimed to help students and staff understand the importance of online safety and develop responsible digital habits.

The event was held under the guidance of Prof. S. A. Kori, Hon’ble Vice-Chancellor, and Prof. C. Sheela Reddy, Registrar and Dean (I/C). In her address, Professor Sheela Reddy urged everyone to stay alert while using the internet and highlighted common online risks such as scams and digital arrests. She appreciated the department’s efforts in taking a proactive step towards promoting safe and mindful use of technology.

The main talk was delivered by Mr. D. Ashok, Assistant Professor in the Department of Computer Science and Artificial Intelligence. He introduced the UGC Handbook on Student Cyber Security Hygiene and explained simple, practical ways to stay secure online– such as protecting personal information and spotting online frauds.

Ms. L. Mahita Chopra, a postgraduate student of M.Sc. Artificial Intelligence and Data Science, gave a practical demonstration on how to keep personal devices secure through the use of strong passwords, antivirus protection, and two-factor authentication. Mr. N. Safin Sulthan and Mr. B. Siddu delivered an insightful session on the Dark Web, highlighting its hidden risks and the need for caution while exploring online spaces. Meanwhile, Mr. J. ## One Day Workshop on Advanced Numerical Methods Through 'R' Software

The Department of Mathematics and Computing successfully organized a one-day national workshop titled "Advanced Numerical Methods Through 'R' Software" on 11 October 2025. The workshop commenced with a traditional lamp-lighting ceremony, symbolizing knowledge and enlightenment. The ceremony was graced by Prof. C. Sheela Reddy (Registrar and Dean In-Charge) along with the distinguished speakers Prof. Ramana Murthy JV and Dr. Srinivas Jangili, and faculty members of the Department of Mathematics and Computing.

Following the lamp-lighting, the convener Dr. Thota Siva delivered the welcome address. He briefly outlined the objectives of the workshop. Dr. Thota Siva then introduced the invited speakers, providing an overview of their academic journey, achievements, and contributions to the fields of mathematics and computational research. This set an inspiring tone for the participants, emphasizing the depth of knowledge and experience the speakers brought to the workshop. The inauguration concluded with an acknowledgment of the support from the university administration and faculty, setting the stage for a day of interactive learning and exploration of advanced mathematical techniques.

The first session of the workshop was delivered by Dr. Srinivas Jangili, Assistant Professor, Department of Mathematics, NIT Warangal. Dr. Srinivas Jangili began the first session with an introduction to the Homotopy Analysis Method (HAM), a powerful semi-analytical technique for solving non-linear differential equations (ODEs and PDEs). He explained the concept of a non-linear operator and how HAM transforms complex non-linear problems into a series of solvable linear problems.

The session highlighted key components of HAM, including the zeroth-order linear deformation equation, base functions, and the convergence-control parameter, which allows flexibility in obtaining accurate solutions. Dr. Jangili demonstrated the applications of HAM in solving problems, emphasizing how this method provides reliable approximations where traditional analytical methods fail. The final session of the workshop was delivered by Prof. Ramana Murthy JV, Professor, Department of Mathematics, NIT Warangal. Prof. Ramana Murthy JV explained the basics of R software and its utility in mathematical computations. He highlighted the fundamental features of R, including how to perform arithmetic operations, define functions and to solve mathematical equations efficiently.

The session highlighted how R can be advantageous over other tools like Python for certain mathematical and numerical computations, due to its simplicity and built-in mathematical functions. Prof. Murthy also demonstrated how R can be used for implementing statistical methods and numerical techniques, providing participants with a practical understanding of its use in solving equations and analyzing mathematical problems. By the end of the session, attendees gained confidence in using R as a computational tool for numerical and statistical applications.

The one-day national workshop on “Advanced Numerical Methods Through ‘R’ Software” concluded successfully, providing a valuable platform for faculty, research scholars, and students to enhance their understanding of advanced numerical and computational techniques.

The workshop fostered interdisciplinary learning, inspiring participants to apply computational tools to complex mathematical problems and explore novel research avenues.


## Mental Health Awareness Week

## Field Visit to Belum Caves

The Department of Geography & Geoinformatics, Central University of Andhra Pradesh, organized an educational field trip to Belum Caves on 4 October 2025 in the Kurnool district of Andhra Pradesh to provide students with practical exposure to geomorphological and geological features. The visit aimed to help students observe landform development processes directly and understand the structural and lithological characteristics of the cave system. A total of 45 students from the Department of Geography & Geoinformatics took part in the trip, accompanied by four faculty members. The fieldwork was supervised by Dr. Saumya Singh and Dr. Abhisek Pal, whose guidance enriched the academic experience. The program received support and encouragement from Prof. S. A. Kori, Vice-Chancellor, and Prof. C. Sheela Reddy, Dean.

The primary objective of the visit was to study the geomorphology of Belum Caves, understand the processes involved in the formation of karst landforms, and analyze the rock structures and lithological variations present in the region. The trip also aimed to strengthen students' ability to apply theoretical concepts to real-world geological settings. The field trip provided students with practical exposure to geological field methods, including rock structure identification, observational mapping, and interpretation of geomorphological processes. The opportunity to study karst landscapes firsthand strengthened their conceptual understanding and improved their analytical and observational skills. The experience also enhanced their confidence in conducting field-based investigations.

The field trip to Belum Caves proved to be a valuable academic experience that deepened students' understanding of geological and geomorphological phenomena. Supported by faculty guidance and university leadership, the visit successfully bridged theoretical knowledge with practical learning and highlighted the importance of fieldwork in geographical studies.



It currently offers nine undergraduate, 17 postgraduate and 15 diploma courses.



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
